FULL BIOGRAPHY:

Alfred L. Williams, the youngest of six children, was born in Little Rock Arkansas to Frances and Grainger Williams. He was raised on Tall Timber Jersey Farm outside of Little Rock where he enjoyed childhood in an ideal setting for a young boy--fishing, working cattle, exploring and riding his horse to his heart's content.

He attended Little Rock Public Schools and then graduated from high school at The McCallie School in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

He graduated from Little Rock University (now University of Arkansas at Little Rock) in 1966 with a BA in History & Political Science. While there, he was elected freshmen men's Senator and Sophomore Class President. He was a member of Alpha Kappa Psi (a national business fraternity), as well as Sigma Nu Social Fraternity serving as Pledge Class President, and Rush Chairman (1964 & 1965). During his college years, he also was a member of the LRU Foreign Relations Club, the University Chorus and the Young Democrats Club.

Upon graduation, he enlisted in the United States Air Force, during which time he was selected as airman of the quarter of the 74th air defense missile squadron, airman of the quarter at the Duluth International Air Force Base, Minnesota, and non-commissioned officer of the quarter at Eglin Air Force Base, Florida. He served his country for four years and was honorably discharged in 1970, completing his service as a staff sergeant.

He entered the insurance industry with underwriter training in Dallas, Texas at the Continental Insurance Company (11/70-10/71). He continued his advanced training with the Continental in New York, New York during April and May of 1972.

His insurance agency career began with The Williams and Rosen Agency serving as a producer and agency office manager. He acquired his Property, Casualty, Life and Health insurance licenses in 1971. Most of his career was as a partner with Ramsey Krug Farrell and Lensing which is now Cadence Insurance. Later in his career he became a Licensed Insurance Risk Consultant. His mentors E. Grainger Williams, Louis Rosen and Tad Krug, exemplified the principles of integrity, honesty, faith and community service. All are members of the Arkansas Insurance Hall of Fame.

Over the years his insurance industry involvement included membership in the Greater Little Rock Insurance Exchange, Member of IIAA of Arkansas; IIAA Executive Committee; IIAA Legislative Committee; IIAA Governmental Affairs Committee; Chairman of the IIAA Young Agents Committee as well as many other IIAA Committees.

He served on The Continental Insurance Company Agent's Advisory Committee for several years and was a member of the USF&G's Financial Institution Product Development Committee (1990-1993).

He received the IIAA Cecil Cleavenger Memorial Young Agent of the Year award (1979) and the IIAA Allan Kennedy Memorial Agent of the Year award (1983).
